Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR)

ACEA's Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) program confronts South Sudan's complex humanitarian crisis, driven by conflict, climate shocks, and economic collapse. Our mission is to save lives, alleviate suffering, and maintain human dignity during and after acute emergencies. We achieve this by pre-positioning emergency supplies, conducting rapid needs assessments, and distributing critical aid to displaced populations.

• Integrated Health and Protection (IHP)

South Sudan's health and protection crises exist in a catastrophic synergy, where a collapsed health system and pervasive violence, including endemic gender-based violence, fuel a vicious cycle of disease and trauma. ACEA's Integrated Health and Protection program aims to safeguard the most vulnerable including women, children, and the elderly from violence, abuse, and preventable disease. Our approach integrates primary healthcare and malnutrition treatment with robust protection services, including GBV response and community-led committees, to holistically address these interconnected threats.

Resilient Livelihoods and Food Security (RLFS)

South Sudan faces a perpetual food crisis where systemic shocks and chronic stressors systematically undermine production, income, and access, trapping the vast majority in crisis-level food insecurity.

ACEA's Resilient Livelihoods and Food Security program aims to break this cycle of dependence on aid by fostering economic opportunities and ensuring stable access to food. We achieve this through climate-smart agriculture training and inputs, vocational skills development linked to markets, and the promotion of village savings and loan associations (VSLAs) to build financial resilience from the ground up.

Sustainable Peace and Civic Empowerment (SPCE)

In South Sudan, a fragile elite peace coexists with pervasive local violence and suppressed civic agency, creating a paradox that hinders true stability. ACEA's Sustainable Peace and Civic Empowerment program addresses the root causes of conflict by healing social divisions and building a foundation for inclusive governance. We achieve this by facilitating inter-ethnic dialogue, training community leaders in conflict resolution and advocacy, and leveraging the influential role of local churches as agents of peace and moral guidance.

OUR PROJECTS IMPACT

Through strategic partnerships and a commitment to localized action, the African Christian Ecumenical Alliance (ACEA) has delivered transformative change across South Sudan. Our integrated approach has created a ripple effect of resilience, protection, and empowerment, touching the lives of over 217,000 individuals in the past year. Here is how our work translates into tangible impact:

Emergency Response • Reached127,000 peoplewith critical protection services. Protection/GBV • 85,000 provided with case management & PSS services Economic Empowerment • 5,000 women and youth Empowered & became entrepreneurs and community economic leaders.




2. The Board of the Directors

- **1. Official Registration**: We are formally registered with the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission (RRC) under Registration Number: 2453, in full compliance with Chapter 3, Section 10 of the South Sudan NGO Act, 2016.
- **2. Tax Compliance:** We hold a valid Tax Certificate from the National Revenue Authority (NRA) under Registration Number: NGO202409255GMXL5, recognizing us as a compliant taxpayer under Section 17 of the Taxation Act.




Figure 8: Women participating in a livelihood skills training at a Women and Girls Friendly Space.
